Colleta Kubik, the speaker last week, talked about Vermilion's future plans for the N&W Railroad making an addition of some passenger service from Cleveland to Toledo. Colleta is a volunteer for the City of Vermilion. She is dedicating her time and resources to better the city by working on the rail transportation service. She said that the plan in the near future is to have six to ten round trips daily commencing at Tower City, Cleveland into Toledo to the West. Colleta said there are also plans to extend the rail service up into Canada by adding a spur rail going up to Detroit. The group hopes to utilize the old (green) depot revitalized by the "Friends of Harbortown" located at the old school house on State Street (Route 60) in the future. In order to put the program together, Colleta said the

**City's projected amount of money to be raised is thirty-four thousand dollars.**

Coletta is one of the group to begin an active concentration in creating the "Quiet Zone" in Vermilion. (No train whistle blowing through town). The project cannot be initiated until "quad-gates" are installed at all crossings in the City. The rail company will close the Perry Street crossing at this time. If this project is put in place, Colleta stated that it will be the first of its kind in Ohio. Counting the two rails spanning the City, Colleta said, at present, there are about one hundred twenty-seven trains per day running through town. There is lots for tourists to see and visit in Vermilion, such as the Parks, Main Street and downtown area, fine cuisine throughout the city, and the fine Lake Erie beaches the town has to offer. Colleta said at this point the project is about two years away from happening.

"The Classification provisions are set forth in article 7 of the standard Rotary Club Constitution. Clubs may not elect a person to active membership from a classification in which a Club already has five or more members, unless the Club has more than fifty members, in which case the Club may elect the person to active membership in a classification as long as it does not result in a classification making up more than ten percent of the Club's active membership. Members who are retired are not included in the total number of members in a classification. The classification of a former member of a Club or a Rotary Foundation Alumnus does not preclude election to active membership, even if the election results in a Club membership temporarily exceeding the above limitations. However, if a member changes classification, the Club may continue the member's membership under the new classification. (RIC5, 2; SRCC 8,2) each active member of a Rotary Club is classified in accordance with the member's business, profession, or type of community service. A Classification describes either the principal and recognized activity of the firm, company, or institution with which a Rotarian is connected; the member's principal and recognized business or professional activity; or the nature of the member's community service activity. (SRCC 7, 1(a)) For example, for the employed electrical engineer, insurance adjuster, or business manager of a railroad company, mining company, or a manufacturing concern may be considered for membership on the basis of his or her position or as a representative of the firm, company or institution. The classification allows a Club to achieve a more diverse professional representation of the Club's community. Each Club should adhere to the classification and membership principles and correct, as opportunities permit, any irregular classifications or membership that may exist in the Club."
