### Last Week:

Betsy Wakefield, Dina Bauer, and Bob Kyle gave an update on the Erie County infant/toddler immunization program with its inception date of 2000. Bob Kyle began the talk by telling a little history of the program. He told the group that in May 1998, a letter from the District 6600 Governor Nominee John Cole asking all clubs to set a goal to help establish an immunization program for the purpose of making the mothers of Erie County aware of their need to begin vaccinating their child at the age of two months. In 1999, the initial meetings began originating at the Huron Rotary Club under the direction of then, President Grant Walls who then invited all of the Erie County Rotary Clubs,; i.e., Huron, Milan, Sandusky, Vermilion to make this a joint venture. In 2000, the organization launched the immunization program and worked jointly through the Erie County Health Dept. in Sandusky because more than half of the children in Erie County receive their shots from the County Board of Health.
