fects of using Murine eye drops. Mike said that Murine is fine but the drops have a rebound effect and shouldn't be used for constant long periods. When asked about the quality of the new hearing aids and if they are covered by insurance, he said that the newest hearing aids are very good and sophisticated. As to the coverage by one's insurance, it depends on the individual's policy. One question was, has the total eye replacement ever been tried, in which Mike said that it would be very hard to connect the optic nerve, but the muscles probably could be attached. Another question was, “when should a parent start taking their child to the eye doctor?” Mike's answer was, “Just as soon as the child can answer questions.” Mike said that Macular degeneration is mostly hereditary. The eye drop medication, AREDS can be used to slow the disease down. Although Dr. Mike's talk was short, it was very informative and to the point of the questions everyone turned in. Thanks, Mike.
