tary's role in the continued maintenance of the Rotary to strengthen our local Community efforts, and to Centennial Park, Pancake Community Breakfast the annual Steak Fry, and the third grade dictionary project. Lynn stated the Club had a busy year with its various programs, which included the Youth Study Exchange (chaired by Sue Hunt) and with honorable mention of Sid and Sandy Jordan as host family. There were \$1500 in scholarship awards given out to the STRIVE students who showed the most progress in their classes. Amy Hendricks headed up the Annual 4-way test Speech Contest this year. A total of \$550 was given to the various contest winners. The Dictionary project was a huge success this past fiscal year. Janet Ford initially started the wheels turning and then co-chaired the project with Pam Reese. Dick Baker's thoughts of helping the needy locals spurred the actions of Janet Ford to initiate the Pancake Breakfast last spring with the cooperation of the Lions Club and the Vermilion Fire Department volunteers. The group collected a total of \$1916 which was donated to the Food Pantry and the salvation Army. This year's Relay for Life event was chaired this year by Pat Stein. The Group Study Exchange program (the Japan business and professional folks) was hosted by Sue Hunt (chair), Dave Blackman, Pat Stein, Summer Barthel, and Sid Jordan. Lynn said the Annual Steak Fry was another a success story this year also, thanks to Bill Gross and Suzanne Zadell, co-chairing the event. Betsy Wakefield and Dina Bauer were recognized for their leadership in the Erie County immunization program. Janet Ford and Pat Stein led the pack of workers weeding and planting flowers on Pride Day this spring. Lynn gave recognition to the Vermilion Charitable Fund directors, Janet Ford, President; Bill Mills, Treasurer; Lynn Miggins, Bob Kyle, Judy Somers, and Dina Bauer. She listed the areas and programs the Club's Charitable Fund dispersed moneys to, which included: Vermilion Food Pantry (\$1000), City Swim lessons (\$1000), Lucy Idol Program, Vermilion Family YMCA (\$1000), Safety Town (\$500), Firelands Academic Challenge (\$250), VHS Speech and Debate Team (\$600),

Junior Achievement program (\$300), Vermilion Mini Bus (\$1000), and the Rotary Centennial Park maintenance.

Lynn said the weekly Rotary programs (speakers) have been excellent this past year. They have been very informative and entertaining. Sue Hunt is the coordinator for the weekly programs with each member taking his/her turn as chairperson during the year. By having each member responsible for the weekly programs this has offered a wider spectrum subjects throughout the year, Lynn stated.
