Dolores Phillips' guest speaker last week was Chuck Dunbar, General manager of the newest enterprise of Vermilion, the Quaker Steak and Lube Restaurant, replacing the Red Clay Restaurant. Chuck said that he lives in Avon area, is married and has two children. Chuck grew up in Elyria, Ohio so he is a local area person. He said that in the past, he has been connected with big oil companies, such as Shell Oil Corporation. Prior to his newest restaurant endeavor, his forte' was the troubleshooter for Shell Oil. He went on to describe the “workings” of Quaker Steak and Lube. Usually, these restaurants cater to motorcycle groups who ride in and spend the afternoon and evening at the facility, but in the Vermilion restaurant, because of the close proximity of the river and the condo residences across the water, motorcycles are kept to a minimum and that there will be no “cruise ins” as in the others in the surrounding cities. also that because of the Sports Bar atmosphere, the establishment has to be aware of the loud sound this type of restaurant generates, such as louder musical entertainment groups and with the sound carrying across the river the bands have to cease playing at 9:45 in the evening. Chuck noted that most of the Quaker Steak and Lubes are franchise driven restaurants, but Vermillion's eatery is a corporate owned and held entity. Most Quaker Steaks have much larger kitchens than the local one so that the menu had to be listed with fewer choices so that the smaller kitchen staff could accommodate the customers in a timely manner. Chuck said that so far the restaurant was very pleased with the business. Its sales have far exceeded all expectations and goals set by the management. He said they came to Vermilion with the idea of making this one restaurant into a family atmosphere serving great steaks, ribs, wings, and all that goes with it. The restaurant's customer capacity is from one hundred fifty to two hundred. During the questions period, Chuck was asked about if there was a parking problem and if there was a need for a parking "spillage" area. He said that the management was working on this. Our thanks to Dolores for bringing this speaker and timely information to our club.
