Last Week:

President-elect, Pat Stein last week's program chairperson and speaker talked about the city recycling business at hand. Pat got the group's attention by passing out rulers (12 inch) made from recycled telephone books and plastic. She said these rulers are just one example of what recycling can accomplish. Pat said that an aluminum soda pop can, when placed in a landfill will stay in its present form for a hundred or more years, but if recycled, it will be back on the store shelves within six weeks. Through the diligent training of the local city employees, Pat has reduced the normal six to eight trash bags per week down to one and a half bags per week. The rest of the stuff, Pat said goes into the recyclable bags. She stated for our home use we should be saving recyclable items in two bags, plastics (#1&2) look on the bottom of the plastic bottle), glass, and metals in one blue bag and newspapers, cardboard products, and shredded paper in the second blue bag. "shiny paper" such as advertisements could be added to the papers. Pat said, as of June, shiny papers are permitted now. Also, phonebooks are allowed to be thrown into the recycle bags at this time. Bottle caps are also permitted as long as they are removed from the bottle. She said those of you who are "chocolate junkies," don't forget to keep the wrappers from your chocolate candy kisses and through them into the recyclables, also. Pat stated that stats show there are 350 thousand aluminum cans produced every minute and 20 million chocolate kisses are wrapped on a daily basis. She said "yard waste" is not accepted as recyclable at this time, but may be later on. Pat suggested each of us start a "compost site" if we have the room on our home property.

Pat mentioned the landfills. They are becoming mountains of garbage in which lots of the refuse will just remain in the landfills without ever breaking down. Pat said the city is giving blue recycling bags out at the Liberty and Main Street city building. They are there for the taking. She brought some with her to the meeting and passed them out. We thank Pat for her expertise in the recycling program and for bringing this very important subject and information to the group.

Eli Roztas reported the Pasta Dinner served at the Triathlon grossed \$1555.00 with expenses of \$194.71, netting \$1340.29 which was split between our club and the Firemen's organization. Great Job, everyone!
