



## **Biographies of Past Presidents**

### **Floyd Hull, 7<sup>th</sup> president of Vermilion Rotary Club**

Floyd Hull was the 7<sup>th</sup> president of the Vermilion Rotary Club. His term was the fiscal year 1934 – 1935. Floyd was born on April 8<sup>th</sup> 1899, graduated from Vermilion High School, and graduated from business college (Probably Oberlin School of Business?). Floyd was manager of Englebry and Hull Coal and Builders Supply in Vermilion. He later bought the Englebrys out of the business in the late thirties or early forties which gave Floyd sole ownership. A few organizations Floyd belonged to were the Lodge of the Master Masons (Ely lodge 424). In the year 1930, he held the East Chair of Worshipful Master of the lodge. Floyd also served as Lodge treasurer. He was also a member of the Royal Arch Chapter 233. He served on the Vermilion Fire Department and held the position of treasurer for eleven years. Floyd was a member of the Vermilion Boat Club and served as The Commodore for one year. He attended and was a member of the Congregational Church in Vermilion.

Floyd was married to Edna (Gegenheimer) Hull and together they had two children, Nelson and Lucile (Hull) Clark.

Floyd passed away at the young age of fifty-two from the disease of “Bulbar Polio.”

Floyd was well liked in the community of Vermilion.
